## ASSIGNMENTS

1. **Create flashcards for each of the tools listed on the AICE English Language Terms to Know document provided on the website. Study them; they will be tested the first day of school!**
  - ⇒ Write the term on the unlined side of the index card.
  - ⇒ On the lined side, include the definition *and* an example.
2. **Create vocabulary flashcards for words you have to look up as you read *Hateship, Friendship, Courtship, Loveship, Marriage*. (This will also help you when it's time to take the S.A.T.)**
  - ⇒ Write the vocabulary word *and* part of speech on the unlined side of the index card.
  - ⇒ On the lined side, include the definition, a synonym, an antonym, and a sample sentence. (An original sentence *or* a quote from the text will suffice.)

3. **For each of the nine narratives in Munro's *Hateship, Friendship, Courtship, Loveship, Marriage*, you must do the following:**
- ⇒ Take notes in your book, as stated in Adler's "How to Mark a Book."
  - ⇒ Complete the following:
    - Analysis Log (found on the website)
    - Write a half-page response to Munro's ideas, either about your feelings *or* the way in which she presents her tale.
